Final Project Result and Finale of the Artistic Journey

In the past few months, the partners worked on completing the final result of the project - establishing youth networks in the field of digital art. Local networks of young digital artists, youth workers and young people were formed in the partner communities in Spain, Italy, Latvia, N. Macedonia and Reunion Island, which designed and carried out different local activities using digital art: local young digital (and other) artists and enthusiasts gathered in Reus and Reunion and shared their work with each other, ways to monetizing digital art were presented in Skopje, in Riga "Latvian Digital Artists Catalogue for Youth" was launched, young artists from Rome explored the potential of ChatGPT for creating digital art. And the partners didn't stop there; the local networks were connected into a large international network of young digital artists that work out possibilities for replicating the local digital art actions and ideas in the partnership countries.

And rounding up this result brings us to the end our project! After 2 years of dedicated and beyond enjoyable collaboration, artistic exploration, preparing an online training kit on digital art, creating an educational game for young digital artists, and establishing networks of young digital artists, we have reached the pinnacle of DALI4YOUTH. Together, we have not only achieved a remarkable milestone, but also paved the way for endless possibilities in the realm of digital artistic expression.
